Federation Update @Sutton @Bugthorpe

Just to keep you informed, the consultation period has now finished and both Governing Bodies will be meeting in early July to vote on whether to go ahead and federate or not. If both schools agree, we could be formally federated for September 2021. This would see our schools governed by one, united Governing Body. It may also provide us with the opportunity to pool together the costs of East Riding service level agreements, and other expenses, to save us more

money to spend on teaching and learning for our children.

Pupil Premium @Sutton @Bugthorpe

Note from the Government regarding Pupil Premium funding:

Dear Parent/Guardian,

We want to make sure that we are providing your child with the best education and support we can. Healthy school food has obvious health benefits and can help pupils establish healthy habits for life. Healthy school food can also help to improve pupils' readiness to learn.

Families who receive certain benefits may be eligible for free school meals. Your child is eligible for free school meals if you're in receipt of one of the following benefits:

- Universal Credit with an annual net earned income of no more than £7,400.
- Income Support
- Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- Support under Part 6 of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The guarantee element of Pension Credit
- Working Tax Credit run-on (paid for the four weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit)
- Child Tax Credit (with no Working Tax Credit) with an annual income of no more than £16,190

Registering for free meals could also raise an extra [£1,320 for your child's primary school]/[£900 for your child's secondary school], to fund valuable support like extra tuition, additional teaching staff or after school activities.

This additional money is available from central government for every child whose parent is receiving one of the benefits listed above.

Please contact the School Office if you believe you are eligible for Pupil Premium funding. Thank you.

End of Year Reports @Sutton @Bugthorpe

Just a heads up, similar to last year, our end of year reports to parents will communicate where your child is 'working at' and there has been no National Testing.

Teachers will be providing their assessment of level of understanding across each subject's performance descriptors for your child.

Children who have met the performance descriptors are working at the expected level (EXP); some children may be working at a greater depth (GDS) within the performance descriptors for their year group. Those who have met some, but not all of the performance descriptors are 'working towards' (WTS).

The teachers and I, are confident that many children would have attained a higher level if it had not been for the impact Covid-19 had on their attendance at school. But we believe it is important to accurately reflect where they are now, based on the national curriculum performance descriptors. Teachers will be liaising closely with their next teacher so that they are aware of each child's strengths and weaknesses, and teachers both here and at the secondary school (for those who are leaving us), will continue to work to fill gaps in pupils' knowledge and understanding.

Over time, we are confident that these gaps will be closed and most children will fulfil their potential; overcoming the barriers Covid-19 has put in their way.

Go Read - Digital Reading Record @Sutton @Bugthorpe

Some of our classes at both Sutton and Bugthorpe are trialling a new reading record app with a view to potentially rolling it out across the school from September. The app will provide an opportunity for both parents and school to celebrate all of the reading that our children do in a quick, easy and eco-friendly way. No more wondering where that lost reading record is!

At school we want to support our children to become responsible readers as there are a multitude of lifelong benefits to reading - confident readers are higher attaining across the whole curriculum; vocabulary development; memory skills; and most importantly, better mental health. All reading is good reading, from bedtime stories to audiobooks, to magazines, and we


hope that our new app will be part of our journey towards helping our children to realise their passion for the written word.
